One day you're watching the news of a virus in a Chinese market. The next you're waking up to all the shops and restaurants being closed, masks mandatory and quarantine. I see news reports of business being affected by 90% and I think, well 10% is better than what I'm making right now.

In The News

Recently discovered documents written by George Kennan (Prague, U.S Consul in 1939) show that the 22 year-old John F. Kennedy visited Prague in August 1939 during the occupation.

Up until January 2020 when I did an Old Town walking tour I used to show a plaque on the square where the Marian Column was torn down in 1918. Now I can show the real thing as a replica has now been built.

A Czech Doctoral student co-authored a snake recognition app so that if you are bitten by a snake and you manage to get your phone out and scan a picture of the snake, the app will tell you if it's poisonous or not and hence what anti-venom is required.

During a press conference by the Czech Communist Party three students projected an image of <u>Milada Horakova</u> (a woman executed during political suppression 70 years ago under communist rule). The students were accompanied by a member of parliament who knew what was going to happen. The communists said "it did not respect democratic principles". Priceless.

Cellular provider O2 has launched its 5G service in Prague and the regional city of Kolin.

The EU Coronavirus fund is expected to give the Czech Republic 19.2 Billion Euros of which 8.6 Billion is a grant and 10.6 Billion is a loan.

There is again a move towards self-sufficiency in food production with recent data showing that currently Czech produces 25% of home consumed vegetables, 40% of pork products and 55% of chicken.

Trivia and Odd Statistics

In 2019, 9% of the Czech population over the age of 15 were subject to a repossession order because of a debt problem.

In 2019 there were 700 recorded cases of anti-Semitism. This was a 100% increase on the previous year. 95% of these were online.

2020 Q1 data shows the average Czech monthly salary is CZK34,077.

2020 Q1 data shows the Czech population rose by 425 to approximately 10.7 million

2020 Q1 data shows the number of marriages fell by 600 to 3500 with the downturn blamed on coronavirus restrictions.

As of June 15th, 10,024 people had been recorded as contracting Covid-19 with 329 deaths.

On the weekend June 13/14th volunteers collected 3.8 tons of rubbish from trails in the Krkonose National Park.

If there are no other attached living expenses it would take an employed Prague resident 14.2 years to buy a 70sqm apartment.

Czech Republic is number 33 in the World Competitiveness Ranking.

A State Health Institute survey found that the percentage of smokers in the 15-24 age group dropped from 35% to 23% since 2017.

The tax on draught (on-tap) beer fell from 21% to 10%.

Based on Mobile SIM card data, 258,000 Czechs returned to the country from abroad during the coronavirus period.

Walking Tours

Well March/April/May was a pretty rubbish time and 2020 is basically a write-off but I'm going to stick with it. I have an excellent reputation and clients who had booked tours this year with me have been sad to cancel. I'm staying flexible.

For Covid-19 we practice separation as possible. If you are family then you don't have to separate. Keep distance between strangers. Carry a mask with you for convenience. I provide hand-sanitiser.

<u>Private tours</u> – must comply with current Covid-19 restrictions which means possibly queuing for some attractions, less space in cafes and restaurants and a mask requirement on Public Transport.

Old Town and Jewish Quarter - Separation as possible.

<u>City Walking Tour</u> – Separation as possible and mask is required for the tram trip.

World War Two - Separation as possible and mask is required whilst inside the train station area.

<u>Architecture Tour</u> - Separation as possible.

<u>Czech Food and Beer Tasting</u> – Currently table spacing is in operation and drinks are served in disposable plastic cups.

<u>Christmas Markets</u> – Any restrictions to be announced when known.
