## Coronavirus Life

From November 1<sup>st</sup> there's a BIG change in the way people check if you are vaccinated against Covid-19. Up until then you could go into a bar/restaurant etc and it was only if the police or health authority person wanted to check the status he/she could ask. From November 1<sup>st</sup> it's up to the venue staff to check. Respirators i.e. FFP2 or KN95 are now mandatory in enclosed spaces.

One day I stopped in the middle of Charles Bridge, sat on the wall and listened to the languages that people were speaking as they crossed in either direction. It was a completely uncontrolled observation but after 20 minutes the most heard language was German followed by Czech, Spanish and Arabic.

The Signal Light Festival was held in mid-October and it drew the largest crowds seen in the city for more than 18 months. It was quite surreal to be jostling through crowds of happy people. As a mainly outdoor event it made masks voluntary but I can tell you there was no chance of any social distancing and had you not known that there was a pandemic at large you'd have thought it was just a regular weekend in Prague. Getting back to normal.

## In The News

Well it was all about the election and the health of the President this month. To call this Parliamentary election historic would be an understatement in several ways. The Social Democrats and the Communist party who had both been in the coalition government failed to get at least 5% of the popular vote and will not be represented in Parliament for the first time since 1918. Only four political parties are in Parliament, the fewest ever. Women now make up 25% of the Parliament Chamber of Deputies, the largest block ever. Did I mention the President? The day after the election much of the population was wondering if Miloš Zeman was actually dead or if not dead then unable to ask anybody to form a new government. It was reported that the current Premier "spoke" to the President but details of what was said were not revealed to the public. Then within an hour of that meeting the President was rushed unconscious to a nearby military hospital. The new Parliament sits on November 8th but it could be another 6 months before we get the constitutional issues relating to the President (and his office) sorted out.

Also in the election, a political party formed in January this year called "Oath" exceeded 1.5% of the popular vote so it was recognised as a valid party and the state will pay it CZK25 Million plus the state provides an additional CZK9 Million each year for the next 4 years to help finance its political campaigning.

With a new parliament on the horizon the question of same-sex marriage is again being talked about. The Czech Republic was the first of the formerly Communist controlled countries to enact a same-sex partnership law but has never legalised same-sex marriage.

## **Trivia and Odd Statistics**

The 2021 Census released data showing that there are 713 Czechs living in the country who are aged 100 or older.

Prague Zoo is 90 years old.

The average Prague hotel occupancy rate in 2021 is currently 18%.

The Prague metro system carried an average of 872,000 people per day in October 2021.

A Czech or Czechoslovak film has won the Oscar for "Best Foreign Film" three times since 1929.

Prague is the 14<sup>th</sup> largest city by population in the European Union.

Since January 2021 Czechs have invested more than CZK3.6 Billion into cryptocurrencies.

1046 people filed to declare personal bankruptcy in July 2021.

The Czech Police has been a member of Interpol since 1993.

Czech Industrial production in the first half of 2021 was 15% higher than the same period in 2020 and reached pre-pandemic levels.

US company NortonLifeLock paid USD8.6 Billion to take over the Czech cyber security firm Avast.

Czech harvested 31,000 tons of poppy seeds in 2021.

At the time of writing there were 350,000 job vacancies being officially advertised in Czech labour offices.

A civil court case in Czech takes an average of 281 days to complete.

The average age of a Paediatric doctor in Czech is 62.

Approximately 166,000 Czechs are classified as either being homeless or in temporary/inadequate accommodation.

# **Walking Tours**

Bucking the trend that the Old Town and Jewish Quarter tour is always the most popular, in the beginning of last month it was actually the Prague Architecture scheduled tour and Private Tours which drew most bookings although the Old Town tour got busier later in the month. Even the Private Tours clients requested architectural content. ### **Viator**

Viator is an online travel agent (OTA) connected to the Trip Advisor brand that carries my Old Town and Jewish Quarter walking tour. It's the same price as if you bought from my own website but I pay an extra 10% in commission fees in the hope of a reasonable amount of traffic. I noted that there were more Viator bookings in October 2021 (mostly for US clients) than in every month since July 2019 COMBINED!

Private Tours can be arranged by contacting me and Other Tours can be booked via <a href="https://www.livingpraguetours.com/">https://www.livingpraguetours.com/</a>. Cash on the day is fine (you must agree this with me in advance) or if paying by card then credit card refunds are 96% (cost of tour minus any card transaction fee which is out of my control). See the scheduled tours status below. If going inside, all clients are required to have a FFP2/KN95 face covering available and you may be asked for proof of vaccination. I provide hand sanitiser.

### **Other Tours:**

Old Town and Jewish Quarter is running normally.

City Walking Tour is running normally (if Prague Castle is closed then the route changes to include John Lennon Wall, Our Lady Victorious if open and the riverside plus there will be no tram ride).



World War Two is running normally.

Architecture Tour is running normally.

Czech Food and Beer Tasting is suspended due to restaurant/bar closures. Option of food/drink is now only on Private Tours.



<u>Christmas Markets</u> has restrictions: "tour-only" in 2021 with time for people to buy food/drink as required.
