Fair Pay

Another communist-era effect rises to the surface. A former Czech dissident i.e. somebody who lived in Czechoslovakia who opposed the Communist regime (1948-1989), went on hunger strike in November to highlight something which happened during communism but was never corrected. As well as murdering thousands of judicial, political and military opponents, if you survived then the communists punished dissidents by deliberately reducing their pensions. More than 25 years has passed and yet only now is this being addressed. I'll add this to my list of "things to talk about with communists" before the next election takes place. So petty. Why would you vote communist knowing the track record.

Rude

I probably offer a unique tour service in Prague in that it's a maximum of 6 people AND if only one person books a scheduled tour place I will still run the tour. So why is it that some people just don't turn up? The confirmation has the details and the "read this carefully" section. You get a reminder. The website tells you the booking process for why you might not receive a confirmation and how to correct that. I'm contactable by phone, SMS, Whatsapp, Signal, email and Facebook Messenger. So no excuses for not taking a minute of time to let me know that circumstances might have changed. I just think it's rude.

In The News

The Disciplinary Committee of UEFA levied a record high fine of 91,000 Euros against Slavia Football club in punishment for offensive chanting, throwing objects, setting off fireworks and other things during a home match against Italian club, Roma. It wasn't stated what the "other things" were but they must have been pretty bad!

The Czech School Inspectorate is recommending that the second foreign language taught in schools should not be compulsory. Seems like a bit of a shock but they report that although pupils are motivated to learn the first foreign language (usually English), the motivation reduces for the next language. 60% of foreign language teachers agreed with the study which suggested that the time be better spent on core subjects.

A lady called Vera Čepelova died in November aged 88. She was one of the last survivors of the Lidice massacre of June 10th 1942. Aged 7 at the time she was sent to a German family and renamed. In 1946 she was reunited with her mother who had herself survived the Ravensbruck Concentration Camp. They moved back to Lidice in 1951 where she spent the rest of her life.

The deputy Minister of Health announced on a Sunday discussion TV program that the Czech healthcare system is set for "major changes" that may be "unpopular" with an overhaul of hospitals and forms of care provided. And there's not even an election planned!

On October 18th Austria introduced additional border control checks for 10 days, that was extended to a month and has now been extended again. The Austrian Interior Minister Gerhard Karner stated it was necessary "as part of the fight against terrorism in the context of the Middle East crisis". I mean. Really!!

In Q3 2023, Czech households reduced their gas consumption by 28% compared with Q3 2022.

Although the phrase "young Czechs" was not defined, research by the HateFree Culture group says 50% of young Czechs would not rent their apartment to a Roma (Gypsy) family.

14% of Czech children experience direct or indirect domestic violence.

Czech Food Inspectors from the Ministry of Agriculture have banned the "Hot Chip Challenge" from Czech shops. Two of the warnings on the packaging included "possible loss of voice" and "blurred vision".

92% of Czech Secondary school pupils would volunteer to learn English as a third language even if it was not compulsory.

6000 doctors in Czechia did not sign an overtime contract for the month of December 2023.

The highest annual rent in Paris Street is 2,700 Euros per square metre which makes it the most expensive in Europe and 11th most expensive in the world.

Czech football team head coach Jaroslav Silhavy resigned minutes after the team qualified for Euro 2024 by beating Moldova 3-0.

An oil painting called Fusion of Souls by Max Svabinsky sold at auction in Prague for CZK15.8 Million.

A Czech Institute of Health report found that more than 4000 people aged under 19 were admitted to an "acute" hospital bed in 2022 for mental health issues. This is almost twice the 2012 figure.

The green jacket worn by Vaclav Havel on the balcony of the Marks and Spencer building on November 21st 1989 sold for CZK2.7 Million.

Walking Tours

Gift Vouchers

Read about the Gift Voucher system on the <u>Gift Voucher page</u>. You can buy individual tours as a gift for somebody and by contacting me the recipient of the gift will have options to swap tours or use the credit to upgrade to a private tour etc. Vouchers are valid for 1 year.

Tours and Card Payment

For any Private Tours or for any Scheduled Tours booked directly through a tour calendar, clients can pay the full cost of a tour in advance by card payment with the understanding that refunds are maximum 96% (cost of tour minus any card transaction fee which is out of my control). In this case you first receive a payment request which has to be completed within 48 hours. Then you receive the booking confirmation.

Tours and Cash Payment

If you prefer to pay for a tour either scheduled or private in cash then you need to contact me. We will agree the tour details and I will quote a price in CZK and your own currency equivalent. You will then receive the booking confirmation and payment is made on the tour day at the agreed amount so in this case there is no advance payment and cancellation is free.

Tours:

Private Tours are arranged as required.

Old Town and Jewish Quarter is running normally.

City Walking Tour is running normally.

World War Two is running normally.

Architecture Tour is running normally.

<u>Czech Food and Beer Tasting</u> is Suspended. The option of food/drink is now only on Private Tours.

<u>Christmas Markets</u> has restrictions: "tour-only" in 2023 with time for people to buy food/drink as required.

Prague O2 Arena – Hauser Concert November 2023
